Report from NMMI New Mexico Military Institute

Dianne has been in contact with our NMMI student Kyle Dietz and received permission to publish his status report in our newsletter.

Hi Dianne,

Sorry to get back to you late, we have just been swamped here lately. Things are going good with the preps here. The last of us "turned" to cadet privates down here. Turning is similar to a plebe class being recognized at USMMA. We essentially got our freedoms back a little, we can now leave campus at anytime on weekends as long as we are back by 5PM and we also don't have to square our corners anymore.

All of the Colorado Preps are doing good so far, our contract with USMMA states that we need a 2.2 cumulative GPA when we leave here and I truly believe that we will all make it for sure. Our challenge at this point is to get a GPA of about a 3.0 at midterms. If we make it then we will be eligible for an early letter of assurance from USMMA. This means that we can start the process of applying for our TWIC cards early and also it is somewhat of a mental reassurance for us. If we don't make the 3.0 GPA at midterms, then we have to keep above a 2.2 GPA by the end of the semester. Generally, anyone who has above a 2.2 will make it to KP.

From what I have been told by some, this is the best preparatory class to go through NMMI so far GPA wise. I think that we also have the highest number of preps that have remained in the program so far out of any prior group. I believe that right now we have 36 out of the original 40 USMMA preps who started here. The major obstacle for us at this point in time is to keep our heads in the game.....This place feels so far away both geographically and academically from USMMA. In reality though, we will be out of here in a little over 3 months, our day at USMMA will be here sooner than we all think.

If you have any questions about NMMI or the prep program I would be happy to answer them.

USMMA Commandant Captain Kennedy's visit to Colorado

At our February 22, 2014 general membership meeting we had the honor of hosting USMMA Commandant, Captain Jay Kennedy and Mrs. Kennedy (Cathy).

The weekend started with the USMMA executive board meeting for a Friday night dinner with Captain Kennedy and his wife. It was truly a pleasure getting to know them on a personal level.

The following day, they attended our meeting which included an amazing potluck lunch and business meeting. The last two hours were left for the Commandant to speak to the audience. Our audience included current USMMA parents, USMMA alumni & friends, current NMMI parents, recruited students and Civil Air Patrol students. In all we had 62 people in attendance. A great turnout for our landlocked state.

Captain Kennedy spoke to approximately 18 questions that had been pre-submitted to him, incorporating the current status and direction of USMMA. He explained that he basically manages the regiment by walking around and interacting with the midshipmen/plebes.

Current enrollment at the academy is 952 (2014-236, 2015-232, 2016-249, 2017-229) (I know those #'s don't add up, but that's what he reported). The class of 2018 will be 250 + setbacks + 5-10 international students

There are 253 midshipmen currently at sea

Curriculum is being rewritten to incorporate new standards and licensing requirements

Explanation of "class" restrictions:

Class 1 is a "felony" by school standards

Class 2 is a "misdemeanor" by school standards

Class 3 is "like jay walking" by school standards

How he is dealing with alcohol issues:

Kids get in trouble in groups

Before his time, lack of consistency in follow up

There are 4 places in Great Neck that don't ID.

He continues to follow up with these venues. One of them is Great Neck Liquor

Stepping up random checks and security

Facilities:

Security of barracks. Beginning 3-3-14 an ID card will be required to access all barrack buildings

Delano is in the final stages of improvement.

Scheduled to be completed in April

Cleveland Hall is almost completed. That will provide 160 more beds

Mallory Pier-on/ahead of schedule. Scheduled for completion end of March

Zero Deck-to be renovated. Will allow for more storage and additional gym space. Scheduled 1 1/2 years from now

Samuels-renovation to begin in 2015

Air Conditioning/Heat-a new company will be evaluating all barracks and repairing as needed

Regarding the subject of "hazing"-it will be more controlled and adjustments are being made

Physical Fitness-"yes" many incoming candidates are coming in out of shape. Many "lied" on their physical application. This issue is being addressed

Current areas of interest

Continued sexual assault prevention and training

The new Kings Pointer should be back to campus by April

An outside company is donating a tug boat to USMMA

There is not enough “white space” in the midshipmen’s schedule/academic calendar, leaving not an ideal amount of time for studies and “free time”. Commandant is working with Dean to change that

A structured program for leadership development is needed

Honor...changing the mindset of making unwise decisions

Physical Fitness...need to be in shape

Sea Projects

Standards are tightening

12 honor code cases currently related to sea projects; many due to ponys. 4 were found not guilty, 4 set back, remainder outstanding cases

Delano has a new food contractor in place

Morale. There is \$260,000 in morale funds available. Looking into reinstalling and spending available funds on morale.

Report from Colorado All Service Academy Ball (CASAB) 2013




It takes 20 working days to process the form, so allow plenty of time. There is no fee required for Military applicants, but a letter from the Commanding Officer stating why you are unable to take care of this in Colorado is required.
